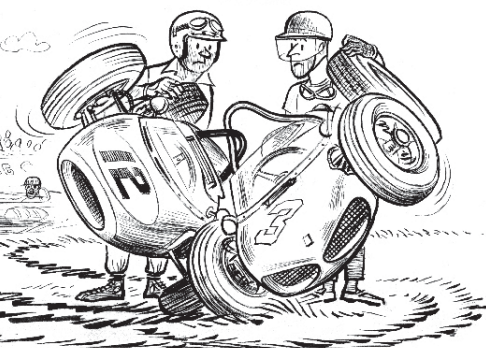

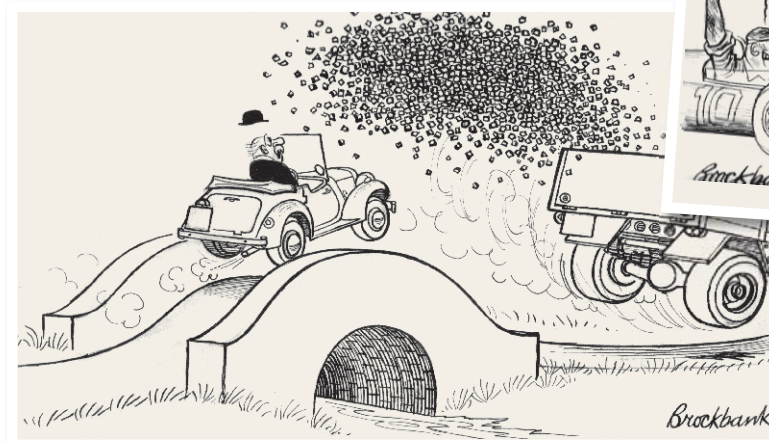
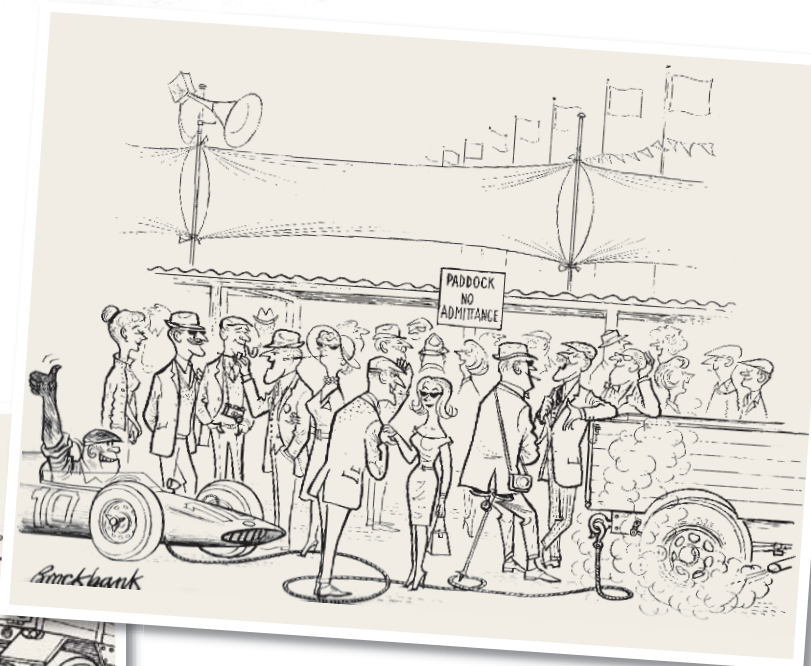
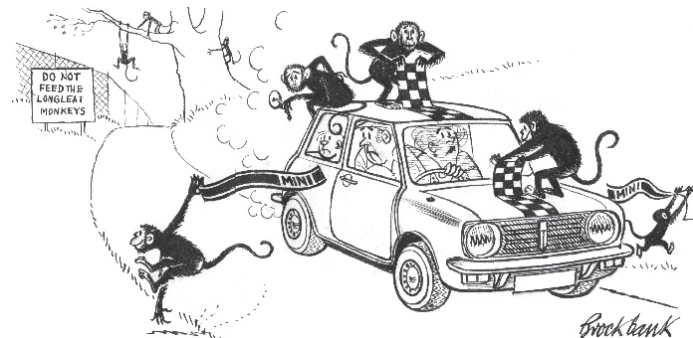
No one saw the lighter side of motoring better than Russell Brockbank with his inspired cartoons. Here the C&SC team presents its 10 favourites from the family collection
